Hurricanes are complicated business. While there is evidence that global warming should increase the frequency of very intense storms, their rarity and complexity make it difficult to detect climate change's fingerprint. It is therefore critical to examine all of the contributing factors. In the case of Hurricane Harvey, these include the warm ocean that provided energy for the storm; the elevated sea level on top of which the storm surge occurred; the atmospheric pressure pattern that contributed to the storm's stalling over the coast; and the atmospheric water vapor that provided moisture for the record setting precipitation. In examining these factors, scientists are deeply sceptical: We start with the assumption that each condition arose by chance, and then require a very heavy burden of proof to reject that assumption (analogous to the "beyond a reasonable doubt" standard in criminal cases).

The first step is to ask whether historical changes have been observed in any of the factors. For example, ocean temperatures have increased in recent decades. Applying the same statistical techniques used in engineering, medicine and finance, we can analyse whether those increases have changed the odds of achieving this year's warm temperatures in the tropical Atlantic and Gulf of Mexico.
